Women's violence is a widespread phenomenon in the European context, 62.000 women have reported violence (FRA, 2014), particularly in the Italian context, 27% have been victims of violence. Violence against women traditionally has been framed as an issue for women and children (European Union Agency for Fundamental Rights 2014; WHO, 2013, 2014;). In some ways, men have been excluded from the conversation, the reason being that men often are perpetrators of that violence. In recent years, this issue has increasingly involved men in the search for solutions, both actively through information, education, and promotion of a non-violence and equal rights culture, and in terms of treatment programs for the offenders (see: Dichiarazione delle Nazioni Unite sulla violenza contro le donne del 1993, la Raccomandazioni Rec (2005) del Comitato dei Ministri agli Stati membri sul Piano d'Azione del Consiglio d'Europa, la Convenzione di Istanbul, art. 16, punti 1, 2 e 3). Europe has a twenty-year experience in the treatment of perpetrators, while in Italy this is a new intervention area. Infact, the first Italian center was introduced in 2009, and generally is oriented toward following international examples and treatment guidelines which have adopted a feminist approach (Bozzoli, Merelli & Ruggerini, 2017). In Italy the perpetrators can access to a center only by a voluntary request, infact there is no legal form established with the judicial system. However, Court, lawyers, as well as social services can advise the perpetrators informally about the specific treatment devoted to them. Currently, in Italy there are 44 centers and organization for the intervention and treatment for perpetrators, distributed as follow: 34 centers in the North and in the center of Italy and 10 centers in South Italy, but only 1 within the public health system (OLV, Asl Na 1 Centro). Italian centers receive each about 30 requests per year of which only 15 perpetrator (on average), undertake a treatment of whom 40% abandon after the first phases of treatment. Merzagora (2009) explains that the perpetrators' voluntary access to treatment produces low demands, so there is a huge number of perpetrators that remains obscure. The difficulty of thinking the perpetrator: as problem to deal with, as area of possible change and as resources are the principal cultural obstacles that contribute to moderate demand for treatment (Deriu, 2017). In Campania Region "Oltre la violenza" (ASL Napoli 1 center) shows the same trend respect to the number of clients as other Italian services. In Campania the low active of perpetrators' service is explained in consideration of a strong patriarchal family culture and a recent spread of the culture of perpetrators treatment. In this sense Campania shows similar contextual and cultural features like the Eastern European and Baltic countries, as Wojnicka (2015) observes. The perpetrators' difficulty in adhering to treatment programs let induce the researches and professionals to focus attention on motivational factors that can support perpetrators and avoid the drop out. To face a low request and adherence to treatment of perpetrators and ensure the success of the programmes for domestic abuse perpetrators, the Council of Europe (2008) stress the importance of intervention that increase motivation to change. There has been limited focus on perpetrator's social accountability in their role as fathers up until recently (Featherstone & Peckover, 2007; Smith Stover, 2013; Strega et al., 2008). Although the recent attention focuses on parental accountability when exposing children to abusive behaviour (Featherstone & Peckover, 2007; Humphreys & Absler, 2011; Strega et al., 2008), little attention has been paid to the role of fatherhood identity as a motivating factor to create insight into the need for behaviour change (Stanley et al., 2012). Given these premises the project Violent Dad in Child Schoes (ViDaCS) aims at supporting the programs for perpetrators, offering an instrument to promote an aware self-assessment of violent behaviour in domestic environment based on the recognition of the effects of violence on their children. ViDaCS aims to intercept the significant number of "silent perpetrators" and address them to a perpetrators' treatment. Main aims:

- ✓ to systematize the international literature on the domestic violence perpetrators;
- ✓ to develop and test an innovative tool to self-assessment of emotional burden and violent behaviour and recognize, as father, the impact of their violent behaviours on those children exposed to domestic violence;

- ✓ to train professionals specialized in domestic violence; and
- ✓ to encourage a multiagency collaborative network among organizations working on this theme.

The project addresses to different kinds of direct beneficiaries:

- a. men who feel their violent behaviour but only partly recognize their responsibility and want to be helped in change their attitudes and behaviour. For this target group, the recruitment will be on a voluntary decision and web-based;
- b. men who not recognize their violence against their partners but in name of their children could be motivated to a possible treatment by using a self assessment serious-game proposed by ViDaCS; and
- c. men who have not entered into the criminal justice system but who have been signaled by social services or victims of violence in order to induce the breaking of the violence cycle , and avoid crystallisation of violent behaviour within the relationship.

Indirect beneficiaries are also: Professionals, educators, experts, police forces, health and social personnel, to be sensitized and supported in their capacity building in threatening perpetrators and more generally fighting against gender-based violence.

### 1.3. RELEVANCE AND JUSTIFICATION

ViDaCS addresses the call purpose to prevent and combat gender-based violence and violence against children under the main priority of “Treatment of perpetrators”, in order to prevent reoffending. We address this priority by developing an innovative emotional and behavioral self assessment tool to address perpetrators to the treatment that offers:

- a) a recognition of the difficulty to manage negative emotions that induce violent behaviour;
- b) an immersive emotional experience of domestic violence in *shoes* of their child when child sees and hears violent domestic scenes;
- c) a recognition, from a child position, of their usual behaviors in classic “domestic scenes”; and
- d) an experience, in the shoes of their child, of alternative “domestic scenes” where the father decides and assumes “new” behaviors that avoid violent behavior.

ViDaCS project has the benefit of contributing, at the same time, to satisfy the priority by supporting the perpetrators treatment in encouraging perpetrators’ motivation. The main output will be a 4.0 ICT **serious game for an immersive emotional experience of domestic violence in the shoes of child to be played by perpetrators.** Its use is a useful protocol for the professionals that work with the perpetrators in the preliminary step of evaluation counselling to the treatment. The ViDaCS emotional and behavioral self assessment is directed to men able to recognize that they committed violence against their partner; while perpetrators who are substance addiction users and with psychiatric condition will be excluded, following the adopted criteria of perpetrators’ selection to the treatment. Moreover the innovative tool proposed can be used by all the actors that get in touch with fathers perpetrators (such as health services, centers for families; services for substance use disorders, care system for children) as a specific emotional experience of domestic violence session that integrates their specific protocol of treatment or as a motivational tool to make them aware of the destructive effects of their violent behaviour. Further ViDaCS output will be an audiovideo tool proposing a special music based creative training directed to all professional to enhance their capacity building, their awareness and competence in dealing with gender-based violence perpetrators programmes. The ViDaCS takes in account the European guidelines (Respect, 2004; Work With Perpetrators, 2008) more particularly the following assumptions:

- a) Fatherhood as core aspect in the treatment of perpetrators;
- b) Violence is a choice; and
- c) The impact and the consequences of violent behaviour on partner and children encourages empathy, responsibility, and motivation to the change.

The project tests how parental responsibility can be a motivating factor for treatment through an immersive experience; this is a first pilot experience using that approach in the preliminary assessment of perpetrators. The impact of parental responsibility for perpetrators on the adhesion to the treatment, until yet has not been verified. The innovative element of the project is therefore the opportunity to benefit from a virtual environment, made possible by the advance technologies

such as Kinect, VR and AR viewers, aptic sensors, to get in direct contact with the child's psychological condition exposed to domestic violence. Serious games are in fact an advanced frontier that reproduces the emotions of human life in certain circumstances so as to create virtual opportunities that can induce identification processes and at the same time lead to empowering transformative solutions.

## 1.4. EXPECTED RESULTS

The main expected result is the **definition of an effective operative procedure to promote perpetrator's adhesion to a treatment**, through the ViDaCS emotional and behavioural self assessment 4.0 serious game. Considering that it is articulated in a) training for professionals and b) development of a serious game to be played by perpetrators, and implemented by professionals from various systems involved in gender violence, we expect it to work as a multiagency supportive protocol from which all these mentioned actors will benefit. ViDaCS program will achieve the aims of the call priority following the call suggestion to involve key players. To this end, a specific role is given to the Campania Region Equal Opportunity Department, and to the Regional Equal opportunities Commission which will support in establishing fertile links and connections with the local relevant services for domestic violence. Indeed, we will develop ViDaCS in continuous consultation with the end beneficiaries (perpetrators, and professionals), involved in: a. preliminary activities (WP2), i.e. in-field research for identifying the needs to be addressed; b. piloting of the game (WP3); c. implementation and evaluation of ViDaCS emotional and behavioral self-assessment program (WP43) by also means of feedback mechanisms (see 1.11). ViDaCS program provide a procedure for professionals of services, involved in the gender violence with specific regards to domestic violence. The procedure ViDaCS supports services' methodologies and competencies of the taken in care of perpetrators, improving their motivation to a specific DVPP. Professionals of systems involved in fighting against gender violence will also benefit from it. Results: improved their knowledge/skills about perpetrators; collaborative multiagency network; receiving a program to take in care the perpetrators and to support the perpetrators' motivation to the treatment.

Perpetrators will benefit from ViDaCS self-assessment that will give them: 1) Experimenting their impotence in dealing with their unbearable emotions and cognitions; 2) Decreasing emotional distances from the child, immersing themselves in their feelings, thoughts and emotions; and 3) Experimenting the effects of the impact of non violent behaviour on child.

Results: a) awareness on own impotence feelings; b) awareness of the effects of violence in domestic violence on child; c) awareness of their difficulty in controlling violent behaviour; d) awareness of a request for treatment at a specialized service.

Indirect beneficiaries:

- Victims of domestic violence: children (victims of WDV) and perpetrators' partner will benefit from violence reduction and decrease;
- scientific community will benefit from a novel tool for the support of DVPP
- local communities/stakeholders will acquire increased and updated knowledge/awareness on perpetrators treatments through dissemination activities

## 1.5. EUROPEAN ADDED VALUE

ViDaCS will provide an EU added value by developing, implementing and validating an innovative practice for the domestic violence perpetrators' self-assessment; this practice is based on immersive emotional experiences, such as 4.0 serious game. Indeed, although several intervention programs about perpetrators have been developed in EU, they a) do not include these kinds of methodologies; and b) do not deepen the fatherhood as motivating factor. These points will be addressed by ViDaCS, thus providing an added value to the current EU state of art in the field: ViDaCS will also create the 1st serious game on perpetrators' self-assessment to be developed in EU with these features. As additional value:

- a) the program itself is a multiagency protocol, involving professionals of fighting domestic violence services from health, social, educational and judiciary sectors; and
- b) the program is a pilot proposal to intercept "silent" perpetrators in all different contexts.

Even if ViDaCS is a national project, its transnational impact will be guaranteed by an intensive dissemination planned in WP5, increasing the public awareness on domestic violence perpetrators and directly involving all the Academic and non-Academic contacts already established by all the Consortium's members in previous experiences.

Moreover, ViDaCS will be easily transferable in other EU Countries thanks to its dissemination kit that will be translated into English and downloadable by ViDaCS website.

## 1.6. METHODOLOGY

We will realize an emotional and behavioral self-assessment program, adopting a self reflective **behavioral approach**. Bonem, Stanley-Kime and Corbin (2008) remark the usefulness of behavioral approach in the perpetrators' assessment procedure; although they add "Assessment strategies that involve classification of battering as operant behavior and application of a functional assessment to determine relationships between batterer-identified antecedents and consequences of the violent behavior are relatively unexplored methods" (p. 212). In a behavioral approach, ViDaCS emotional and behavioral self-assessment program aims at offering an opportunity to perpetrators: a) to deal with their unaware hidden feelings and cognition related to their partner; b) to observe themselves, through the child's eyes, in concrete multiple exemplars (scenarios) that represent the common **antecedents that induce them to adopt** violent behaviours; c) to experience the **consequence** of the violent behaviour's impact on the sensations, emotion and thoughts of their child; and d) **to decide to adopt alternative behaviors**, during the game, and to go through the impact of these alternative scenarios on their child. In this decision the perpetrators will be assisted by specialized professionals, who encourage the experience of alternative behavior to the violence. To facilitate the perpetrators' recognition of the antecedents and consequence of their violent behaviours, ViDaCS program proposes a serious game in which the perpetrator is "in child's shoes", assuming that this experimental position of identification in the other bodies, feelings and cognition is useful to give to the perpetrators the opportunity to discriminate between appropriate and inappropriate behaviours in domestic context. We will apply this behavioural approach in combination with the feminist perspective on violence against women that considers violence as a phenomenon due to an asymmetric power both in the

gender relationships and in the familiar ones. We identified serious games as **behavioural lever for learning by doing** and we will propose 2 main methodological tools: 1) **the immersive characteristics of a 4.0 ICT serious game**. By simulating a simplified version of reality, the serious game help people understand variables, causes, and effects impacting decisions in the real world through role playing exercises; and 2) **Professional's support to the emotional and behavioural self-assessment experience**. Their participation have many advantages: to help identify perpetrators' emotions and thoughts and guide the experience of violence alternative behaviours. Moreover, our methodology includes a **robust evaluation procedure** (see section 1.11) following the before and after comparison, and the differences in differences methodology, based on the use of both qualitative and quantitative instruments. In this perspective, the complementary use of qualitative and quantitative tools is considered as an epistemological need to validate hypothesis on mental and social functioning, by intersecting indexes and data obtained through heterogeneous tools (Moro, 2002). 5 complementary WPs are planned: **WP1 – Project Management and Coordination**: parallel to all WSs; **WP2 – Preliminary researches and activities underpinning**: a) development and implementation of emotional and behavioral self-assessment program: *Methodology*: literature review on domestic violence perpetrators; and **motivation and assessment procedure**; in-field research with quali-quantitative methods and quali-quantitative analysis of the collected data; b) an intensive mutual learning experience to create a common specific-designed approach and acquire the necessary skills to apply it. *Methodology*: video presentation, group discussions and workshops. **WP3 – Design and construction of ViDaCS Serious Game**: design and technical realization of a point-and-click interactive game with different scenarios of potential abusive situations. *Methodology*: a) development of a game background, based on the technical framework of EU project b) creation of an interaction scheme. **WP4 – Training and Implementation**: core activities of the project: a) **Cascade training**: The staff who took part to the mutual learning of WS1 will provide theoretical- experiential training on the ViDaCS program. *Methodology*: workshops, face-to-face and participatory learning; b) **Implementation of ViDaCS package**: the so-trained operators will implement ViDaCS under the supervision of the Academic Partner. *Methodology*: serious game and professional' support to the emotional-behavioral self-assessment. **WP5 – Dissemination and Communication**: all activities conducted in the other WPs will convey and be disseminated in this WS. *Methodology*: web and traditional dissemination (see 1.12)

## 1.8. THE PARTNERSHIP AND THE CORE PROJECT TEAM

The rationale under our Consortium is **multiagency**: we included both an Academic Institution, experienced in research and training with a wide experience in fighting gender –based violence (DSU); its added value is the collaboration of Mind Gender Language PhD Students and professors. Furthermore OIV (Oltre la violenza), center of the public health system (Asl Na1 Centro) for perpetrator treatment bring its competence on perpetrators treatments; Associations with strong territorial/international linkages to schools, centres and child protection systems (CTS and RIA), special Rehabilitation Center skilled in the therapeutic use of serious game (VDG) “VILLA DELLE GINESTRE” as well as private entrepreneur for the construction of serious game (PROTOM) are also part of the consortium.

These territorial organizations attain the call aims, by guaranteeing the involvement of several agencies fighting against gender based violence. They will work side-by-side for the design, implementation and supervision of ViDaCS self assessment and treatment package, thus ensuring a multidisciplinary work. We selected Partners among the most active in fighting against gender based violence with previous collaborations among them and with DSU, to guarantee a consolidated working team. DSU has a great multidisciplinary experience in gender violence issues, prevention, organizational and community strategies for the empowerment of social and health personnel in dealing with gender violence perpetrators and victims. As a strength, we included ROOTS IN ACTION, an innovative association for social promotion especially focused on sensitization through music and creative expression. Its expertise in developing innovative prototypes of intervention based on music therapy and psychological support will provide the technical skills for the theoretical-experiential training. We choose RIA also because it includes associates with research/scientific skills and gender issues specific competencies. We also considered as an opportunity the PROTOM experience in management and technical facilities for research and development in the context of the ICT of Local Public Administration,

We involved then as public authority the Campania Region Equal Opportunity Department and the Campania Region Equal Opportunity Commission both with address and coordinating functions in the local health and social system. We selected public authorities for public support, to ensure a capillary diffusion of the project among the local social and health services, thus guaranteeing the participation of personnel in training and implementation.

The Consortium will be coordinated through a careful activity of project management, through project meetings, online meetings, a Central Project Office and a Steering Committee (see WS1). Another strength is the multidisciplinary of our core project team, to be enlarged by recruiting personnel with previous experiences in child psychopathology prevention.

A careful project management (WP1) will guarantee a constant monitoring including 4 project meetings at key points, to ensure a full exchange of experiences and views among Partners and a shared on going evaluation. For each WP specific monitoring measures have been considered (see 1.11). A Central Project Office (CPO) under the responsibility of DSU and a Strategic Management Committee (SMC) will be created (see WP1). CPO will be responsible for day-to-day administration, executing SMC decisions, continuously verifying that the project is proceeding as planned, by finding solutions to possible problems. SMC will address all the strategic, technical and methodological issues and will monitor progress at each stage, ensuring consistency with the original aims; it ensures also that research activities are properly carried out. Moreover, a Local Training Board and a Local Implementation Board will be established to monitor and take relevant decisions.

Possible risks: a) *Management risks*: unsuitable coordination, conflict among partners, partner drop-out; loss of a key staff member. These risks are not very likely as DSU has already successfully coordinated several EU projects, and has already collaborated with the Partners; and b) *Technical risks*: inappropriateness of the designed tools. Very low risk since DSU has a major experience in designing training, intervention and analysis tools that have been perfected in several EU projects and contexts. To avoid this risk we planned for each WS a task for a careful planning of methodologies to be used and a piloting; and c) *Risks related to the implementation*: lack of participation by trusted adults/professionals. Very low risk since the Consortium already has active local collaborative networks; moreover, the conference presentations will involve key actors to raise awareness on the project in an effective way; certifications of attendance and training credits will be provided to encourage participation.

Communication needs and objectives can be summarized as follows: - to reach end beneficiaries in order to guarantee an adequate participation to the project activities (recognizable logo and image of the project will be necessary); - to share with scientific community and local communities the ongoing and final results of the project; - to

create the opportunity for ViDaCS to be multiplied; - to identify the right way of how to talk and communication about domestic violence perpetrators. To adequately satisfy these needs we planned a workpackage (WP5) specifically dealing with dissemination/communication. CTS, with great experience in advocacy campaigns, has been expressly involved in the Consortium to distribute the knowledge generated by the project within its network of professionals/organizations fighting domestic violence. Target groups and multipliers to be addressed for dissemination are: *Relevant stakeholders* from private and public sectors working against domestic violence that could be interested in disseminating ViDaCS program, promoting its sustainability and establishing strong relationships with our Consortium; *Scientific communities* in Social Sciences to spread methods and scientific results. Key messages of our communication and dissemination activities will deal with: the urgency of intercept a high number of “silent” domestic violence perpetrators through a multiagency work among professionals, Academia, third sector and local communities; and the importance of fatherhood in the engagement of domestic violence perpetrators. Tools and strategies will be carefully defined in a Dissemination and communication plan. To reach target groups and ensure effective dissemination, we planned 3 main moments through traditional and web-based communication channels: a) Launch (M4–7) - to present the project: international presentation conference (Naples), flyers, advertisement on journals, on-line bulletins, links to friend websites, TV/radio spot, flash mob and a logo; In-itinere (M8–21); along the implementation: a) channels to spread ViDaCS in scientific community: participation in national and international congresses, articles on international peer-reviewed journals; b) channels to reach web users: project website, social network page, youtube channel, periodical newsletter; Final (M22–24); to spread results: dissemination kit with user manual, one final international conference. To facilitate further use/transferability: we will realize a dissemination kit in English freely downloadable by ViDaCS website, including the final version of the serious game and a user manual to accompany its application in new contexts. All conferences will host international key experts to facilitate the international dissemination and exchange about domestic violence perpetrators. Finally, contexts for ViDaCS use are widespread in any Countries and, thus, easily to be involved; this will strongly facilitate its replication elsewhere. News opportunities of funding will be searched to allow a further experimentation of ViDaCS on an International scale.

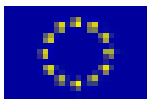

**Project Violent Dads in child shoes (ViDaCS)**

The University Federico II, Department of Humanities in collaboration with local institutions and associations is proposing the project "Violent Dads in Child Shoes" aimed at supporting treatment for perpetrators (priority 1.4, of the above mentioned call) offering a program to promote an aware self-assessment of violent behaviour in domestic environment and recognition of the effects of violence on their children.

Main aims of this project are:

- ✓ Systematize the international self-assessment of motivation to the treatment and the best practices to engage men in programmes
- ✓ Develop and test an innovative serious game to self-assessment and to recognize, as father, the impact of their violent behaviours on the children, exposed to domestic violence
- ✓ Sensitize through new creative methodology professionals and to train operators specialized in using new virtual and relational tools for the treatment of perpetrators
- ✓ Provide guidance for perpetrators self assessment of motivation to treatment

Our office, the Regional Department for Equal Opportunities works to propose and coordinate initiatives aimed to the implementation of equal opportunities policies, the acquisition and organization of information through the creation of specific databases, the coordination of study initiatives, the realization of equality-related projects and the definition of new intervention policies. These tasks are carried out by both following the region's directives and listening to and receiving citizens' requests. Our work is focused on two main purposes: the enhancement of women-men equal opportunities in the Region and the consolidation of the participation of already-involved associations. The department has proposed a "Memorandum of Understanding for the realization of contrast actions to gender violence" aimed to prevent and contrast gender-based violence. 

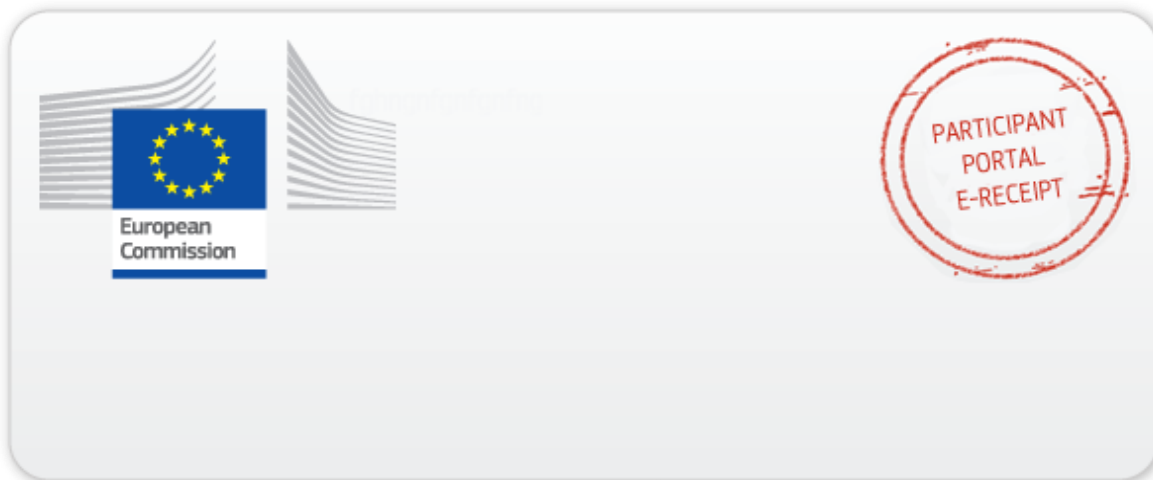
